



California Proposition 65 Statement

Proposition 65, officially known as the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, was enacted as a ballot initiative in November 1986. The proposition protects the state's drinking water sources from being contaminated with chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm, and requires businesses to inform Californians about exposures to such chemicals.

Proposition 65 requires the state to maintain and update a list of chemicals known to the state to cause cancer or reproductive toxicity.¹

Selective Plating provides a service to its customers for work-in-progress raw material as part of the manufacturing process for industrial, commercial and consumer products. By the nature of its business, Selective Plating is not aware of the specifics of the final use of the material. Selective Plating is not involved in the design, testing or distribution of the sub-assemblies, components or final products made from material processed in its plant.

Selective Plating provides electroplated copper, nickel and tin onto customer-supplied base metals. The makeup of the metals used by Selective Plating are governed by ASTM standards. These materials may now be on or may someday be added to the list of chemicals maintained by California under this law. Trace contaminants of materials that may now be on or may someday be added to the list of chemicals maintained by California under this law may be present in the metals we use.
